## Greetings fellow Border Agents,

Well it's been a very sobering week for many of us in San Diego County as a result of wild fires that raged in Southern California and threatened the homes of many of our fellow members. The fire which started in the Witch Creek area near Ramona first neared the home of Dave Burnett who, despite an evacuation order, remained behind. As the fire continued west, it approached and passed within blocks of Charlie Hill's home in Poway. He had to leave his home under an evacuation order during the a.m. hours of October 22. Almost simultaneously the fire crossed over the mountain and approached our home in Escondido. We were evacuated at 2:30 a.m. on Oct. 22 by the Escondido Police as we watched the flames come over the mountain behind our home and roll down its face like a lava flow. We did not know until three days later that our house was still standing. The flames fanned by the fire storm and 60 plus miles per hour Santa Ana winds continued toward our home and reached within 50 feet of our back yard. Apparently the winds then drove it up the slope to the right rear of our home where it took out about 10 homes on the slope and at the top of the ridge and a total of 28 homes in various parts of our neighborhood while firefighters fought to keep it away from our row of houses. As the fire continued west from Escondido and Poway and into Rancho Bernardo it raced through John Windhams' neighborhood and took out rows of houses within a couple of blocks of John's home. He too had to be evacuated. Prospective member Rick Sanchez together with his horses in the East County of San Diego had to evacuate. Several of our members in South and East San Diego County including Bobby Canales faced possible evacuation and many felt the effects of smoke from the Otay Mesa fire, however, to my knowledge, none had to evacuate. Although at least one close friend in Rancho Bernardo within a few miles of Charlie's residence lost his home as did everyone in his cul de sac, we were very fortunate that, at last count, no FOBA members lost their homes.

By way of demonstrating the magnitude of the fires, I don't think there is a member residing in, or a member who knows someone residing in San Diego County that wasn't affected by the fires. I would like to take a minute to thank the many members from throughout the southwest who called to inquire as to our well being and that of our fellow members. A heartfelt thanks goes out to all of you. Considering the extent of the fire, the number of evacuees and the potential for even greater disaster, one can only thank God for saving our fellow members and their families. It is my understanding that the fires resulted in the largest evacuation to ever take place in the history of the United States with over 1/2 million in San Diego County evacuated and over a million in Southern California. Yet incidents were virtually non-existent in San Diego County. And the spirit of helping your fellow man was prevalent throughout. After the fires came under control signs appeared everywhere thanking the fire fighters and the first responders. And everyone felt confident that their homes would be secure when they returned under the checkpoints established by the Police and National Guard.

On a lighter note, the Board of Directors meeting in Ruidoso, New Mexico was a great success by any standard. Ruben and Bonnie Gomez went out of their way to insure that the accommodations and the hospitality were A-1. And if this meeting was any indication, they will certainly have a well planned presentation at Minden to entice us into making Ruidoso the home of the 2009 convention. We were very fortunate to have combined the Board meeting with the annual Cowboy Symposium in Ruidoso. The attractions were many and the entertainment endless. The bands played day and night whether it was Country and Western, old standards, or Country Swing in the style of Bob Wills and the Texas Playboys while the vendors plied their wares from boots to buckskins and handcrafts to horse trailers. Meanwhile out on the range the various ranch crews opened up their Chuck Wagons, (that's right just like the ones designed by Charles Goodnight) and established their camps, dug their pits set up their camp fires and started cooking everything from biscuits to camp stews. The Chuck Wagons were judged on authenticity and the cooking was also judged accordingly. Spectators got to sample their labors of love or they could purchase an opportunity to set down and have a full breakfast, lunch or dinner with the camp cooks. That is if you were lucky, because tickets were sold out for most events before they even began.

It was a well attended board meeting with over 30 border rats, spouses and significant others in attendance. Tommy Donalson announced that our Treasury was at a healthy level (my definition, Tommy never thinks it's at a healthy level) and Irene Guzman announced that the cell phone and boot drive had netted us approximately \$2,500.00 which will help us make the Treasury even healthier (my definition).

Don't forget to get your reservations in for the convention in Minden, Nevada. Al Mc Master and Bill Meglen have been working hard over the past year to insure that a good time will be had by all. They have lined up a number of great events for us. There's so much to see and do in that part of the country, you may even want to consider extending your stay. Personally I'm looking forward to getting back to Virginia City and the Bucket of Blood Saloon. But really, don't wait until January to make your reservations. Get your commitment in as soon as possible so that Al and Bill can plan accordingly.

## **NATIONAL CUSTOMS MUSEUM**

Since 2002, several retirees have gotten together and formed a Committee to create a National Customs Museum. The Committee was adopted by AFCSA and with their support we have made a major step in accomplishing this goal. We visited several museums in the DC area and determined that we would be most successful in using the DEA Museum as a model. Their staff has been most helpful and we learned several short cuts to accomplishing the mission. It was noted that it took DEA ten years to open their museum. The most important lesson we learned was that you must have the support of the agency,

Since September 11, 2001, Customs has gone through many changes and it has been difficult to keep track of Customs and Border Protection Headquarters (CBP) personnel. In September 2006, we met with Commissioner Basham and he was supportive of the idea, however, he wished the project would include all the present agencies in CBP. That would involve Customs, Immigration, Border Patrol, and others. We pointed out that Immigration had a National Museum on Ellis Island in NY and the Border Patrol had a National Museum in El Paso, TX. We considered several sites, including Customs Houses in Boston, New York, Charleston, New Orleans and San Francisco, however, it made sense to explore the possibility of including the Museum with the Immigration Museum on Ellis Island. We met with the National Park Service in September 2006 and April 2007. They indicated that there was space on Ellis Island, however, it would require a substantial financial commitment. Following the example of DEA, we decided to create a Foundation to financially support a National Customs Museum.

In October, 2007 we have filed an application for a National Customs Museum Foundation in Washington, DC and have applied to IRS for tax-exempt status. Once the Foundation has status under Section 501(c)(3), we will begin to solicit donations. We will prepare a professional presentation to present to the public and we hope that many of you will support a National Customs Museum.

In September, I attended the 15th Conference of the International Association of Customs Museums in Antwerp, Belgium. I learned that most of the museums are run by active duty Customs personnel and most of the museums are located away from Headquarters. Following the conference, I had the opportunity to visit the Customs Museums in Antwerp and Rotterdam, Holland.

Presently, we are planning a visit to Customs and Border Protection Headquarters in November and hope to obtain a firm commitment by management to a National Customs Museum. We would like to suggest to them that together we place a temporary Customs and Border Protection exhibit on Ellis Island. We had on display at the New York Customs House a exhibit to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of that building and that exhibit is now packed and ready to be shipped. Bob Fischler, who accompanied me during my last visit to Ellis Island, is in possession of the material and we hope to put this exhibit on display at the Immigration Museum after the first of the year.

During my April 2007 visit, the National Park Service (NPS) mentioned that the Ellis Island Immigration Museum was interested in looking into exhibits involving Immigration prior to the creation of Ellis Island and the Immigration Service. Since Customs handled those issues from 1789 to 1890, we suggested to NPS that we could be of assistance in that area.

One of our successful efforts to date involves the video recording of interviews with retirees. One of these interviews involved retired Customs Attache F. Ben Murphy, age 95, who resides in the Tampa area of Florida. **We hope to attend a future FOBA Convention and conduct a few interviews with your attendees.**

Subject: Death of **Lou Murray**

Louis U. Murray passed away Friday, August 24, 2007. Lou was born on March 03, 1925 in Gary, Indiana. He was raised in Gary, Indiana. Lou is survived by his sons, Walter Murray and Mike Murray, of Chula Vista, California, and his sister Lois Griffin of Rochester, New York.

"During the Second World War Lou Murray was trained as a pilot at Tuskegee Army Air Field as part of an all Black unit of the Army Air Corps. Lou was at Tuskegee Army Air Field starting in 1944. He graduated in Class SE-45-C on May 23, 1945 as a Flight Officer and served honorably during WW II.

He was a Member of the Tuskegee Airmen, Inc., Gen B.O. Davis, Jr. Chapter in San Diego, from 1995 until his death." During the Second World War, 1943 to 1947, Lou was in the Army Air Force, attached as a pilot to the Tuskegee Pilot Program as one of the first colored pilots in our military services who served honorably during the Second World War.

It is my understanding that there are only around 200 surviving pilots and approximately surviving ground crewmen left.

After the war, Lou went to work as a crop duster and then worked for the U. S. Postal Service. In 1952, he joined the U. S. Customs Agency and attended Customs Port Investigators' School at Fort Slocum near New Rochelle, N.Y. During his service with Customs, Lou served as a Sky Marshal and on the security detail for Governor George Wallace, who at the time was running for President. In the merge of 1973 Lou was transferred to The Drug Enforcement Administration and Lou retired in 1984 in San Diego, California

It is anticipated that Lou will be interred at the Naval Cemetery at Point Loma in San Diego California. His brother survivors of the Tuskegee's Airmen Association will be conducting a memorial for him some time in September.

Lou was a former member of FOBA.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to Don's family and we join them in their grief on his passing.



**QUALIFICATIONS FOR FOBA MEMBERSHIP**

**REGULAR:** A REGULAR Member shall have the right to one vote and shall have the right to hold office. To be eligible to be a Regular Member, a person shall:

- (a) Have been an 1811 Agent in a Federal investigative service and assigned to and living on the Mexican Border for a period of at least three years; or
- (b) Have been an 1811 Agent in a Federal investigative service for a period of at least three years and currently assigned to a post of duty on the Mexican Border in an 1811 position; or
- (c) Have been a Federal law enforcement officer assigned to, and living on the Mexican Border for a period of at least three years, and currently serving in an 1811 Agent position; or
- (d) Have had, or currently has, direct supervisory responsibility for the US/Mexico Border law enforcement activities of the 1811 Agents of a Federal investigative service.

**ASSOCIATE:** To be eligible to be an ASSOCIATE Member, a person shall:

- (a) Have been an 1811 Agent in Federal service or have been in a comparable position in the State or Local employment sector and on many occasions conducted criminal investigations with a federal law enforcement office on the U.S./Mexico Border; or
- (b) Be the spouse of a Regular Member in good standing;1 or
- (c) Be the surviving spouse of a deceased Federal criminal investigator who met the eligibility requirements for Regular Membership.
